HEALTH & WELL-BEING PARENT WORKSHOP

Previously this term, HIP Psychology had worked with our Key Stage 2 pupils and the staff as part of staff development this year on the areas of resilience and well-being.

The programme has been a joint initiative with our local Loughshore Primary Schools (Derrychrin PS., St. Peters PS., Moortown, St. Patrick's P.S., Mullinahoe, & St. Patrick's PS., Loup) focusing on Health & Well-Being of everyone during the current COVID pandemic.

HIP Psychology comes with a wealth of experience having worked with over 130 schools in the last two years as well as working with Ulster Rugby delivering sport psychology support.

The workshop was an interactive, engaging webinar that provided parents with strategies to support their child.

The sessions covered three key themes:

- How to support the different areas of your child's well-being.
- Resilience what it is and practical strategies to enhance it.
- Effective Communication with your child, dealing with praise and supporting them through setbacks.

As part of our Health & Well-Being initiative this year linked to the COVID pandemic and Education Restart, we are delighted that Lorretta Daly from 'Fresh Little Minds' is currently delivering a six week programme to our P1-P4 pupils.



STEM VIRTUAL WORKSHOP

P5-P7 pupils got the opportunity to participate in a STEM virtual workshop delivered by SENTINUS with the pupils making a moveable machine/car. They then completed a Science investigation to find out the distance and time travelled using a ramp. The science investigation template included questions, predictions, factors and resources which was also linked to Numeracy and Literacy.

The pupils developed many STEM skills and with many future engineers enjoying the practical learning.



EXECUTIVE UPDATE ON CHRISTMAS BUBBLING

Recently, the NI Ministers outlined a package of measures agreed by the Executive. Shops, hairdressers, restaurants, places of worship and hotels were among places that re-opened from December 11.

The Executive also agreed Christmas household bubbling arrangements from December 23-27. Three households will be able to come together for this period in domestic settings, outdoor public spaces and places of worship. One of the households will be able to include their existing household bubble.
