#### DROP OFF 8:30am - 9am.

### Child Protection/Pastoral Care

These are on display in school and will be reinforced throughout the school year. ### **COVID Guidelines**

Please note the following Covid Guidelines issued by the Education Authority for this school year: -

- Adults with a positive test result will be advised to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for five days after the day of the test, or from the day symptoms started.
- For children (under 18 years of age) this period is reduced to three days.
- As a precautionary measure those who test positive should avoid contact with individuals who are at 'higher risk' from COVID for ten days.

All children continue to wash hands on arrival to school and at various times throughout the school day.
